THE DINING ROOM... benefits from the artistic aspects of the free standing stone wall. The partitioning of the floor space created an ever changing vision of the other rooms from many angles including water views. THE GALLERY... from the entrance, the 14-foot-wide gallery with floor tile wave theme runs the length of the residence to meet the walls of glass overlooking the water. The free standing stone wall (left) facing the metallic covered wall creates the gallery effect as well as the partitioning of rooms.

exploded glass lapis dining table with two extensions is one-inch thick and rests on a stainless steel base. Modern art deco chairs upholstered in a confederate grey/blue fabric on the seat, are contrasted with a vibrant orange flexed fabric on the back complementing the warm patina of the mahogany frame.
